- There are FIVE questions in the Dynamic Techniques Module Examination. You are required to answer **THREE** questions of your choice from the **FIVE** supplied.
- Your CANDIDATE NUMBER must be placed on the top right corner of **each page**. Do not show your name on ANY of your papers, charts or computer printouts. If using Solar Fire Charts, ensure Solar Fire “Chart Page Compliments Text” does not contain your name or is turned off.
- Each answer should be clearly marked with the question number you are answering and each question should be stapled together as a separate unit. No loose papers please.
- **TWO copies** of each of your answer papers must be returned to the Exam Board Director, otherwise marking of your papers will be delayed whilst the Board awaits a second copy to be sent.
- Your answers must be returned to the Exam Board Director, postmarked **no later than Monday the 6th November 2006**. We recommend using Express Post to minimise the risk of lost or delayed exam papers.
- Once the examination commences and you then decide that due to personal circumstances you will not be completing the exam, please advise the Exam Board Director ASAP.

OTHER INFORMATION

This is an unsupervised examination. You may use a computer program to generate any or all of your data, however, please include details of your software in your bibliography. **All** sources of information used in your research must be included in your bibliography, including quotations. They should also be referenced within the text of your essay. Plagiarism will result in failure in the exam so all sources must be acknowledged. Examiners will be marking on the validity of your argument, not right or wrong answers. You must also demonstrate the use of counselling skills which support the client. All statements made in your answers need to be supported with Astrological reasoning.

You may use any form or chart style or 90 degree dial.

Each essay must comply with a maximum word limit of up to 2,500 words with a +/- 10% tolerance. Not only are you assessed on your astrological knowledge, consideration is given to your ability to write a properly structured, succinct and academic work which may (with consent) later be published in the FAA Journal. The 2,500 word limit applies to the essay's Introduction, Body and Conclusion. Any title page, charts, tables, bibliography and references are not included in the word limit.

Essays should be typed and double line spaced using a font of Times New Roman (or similar) with a 12pt font size.

Natal configurations, such as house positions, aspect patterns and rulerships should be taken into account in your analyses, only as far as they specifically relate to the question. A full natal delineation is not required.

Be sure to state your astrological reasoning throughout your answer. Ensure you include all charts generated with your answers.

Please indicate the word length at the end of each essay (introduction, body and conclusion only).

Question 1

Jason has spent most of his life 'under the thumb' of his father and various women. Early this year his marriage broke down and he is trying to rebuild his life and himself. Using his Solar Return for 2006, location Sydney, what guidance can you provide to assist him in his life direction and laying down firm foundations for the future. (Born 15 June 1970, 10.15 am Beirut, Lebanon Asc near 7 Virgo)

Question 2

Susan has come to see you after a particularly difficult year. Her life fell apart when her husband left in March, 6 weeks before their second child was due. They have since reconciled but Susan feels there is much healing still to be done. Using a combination of Transits and Secondary Progressions discuss how you would help Susan understand the process she has been experiencing during 2006 and how she can become more self aware and proactive over the next 12 months. (Birth data – 8th August 1981, 9:12 pm Moorabbin Victoria, Asc near 29 Pisces)

Question 3

James has just turned seven. His behaviour this year has deteriorated to the point where his mother says he is becoming out of control. He is being excluded from class due to his outbursts and this is affecting him socially as well as academically. He is a bright child and generally a delightful and charming little boy. His mother is now feeling pressured to medicate James, but is concerned this will destroy his personality and is not keen to follow this path. She has come to see you as a last resort, feeling that by gaining an understanding of the current energies affecting James she may better understand *how* and *when* further changes are more likely. She is not asking for you to make any decisions, but to assist her understanding of the planetary influences and how they can best be used in a positive manner.

Using personal planetary cycles and their effect on James throughout 2006/2007, *e.g. Saturn cycle, Mars cycle and Progressed Moon*, what guidance can you give his mother regarding the transformation he has undergone, and is undergoing, and some suggestions that may facilitate positive change in his responses to the influences around him. She lives alone and is solely responsible for her own welfare. She knows a little astrology and is aware the current Saturn-Neptune opposition is in close proximity to her natal Sun.
