- There are FIVE questions in the Dynamic Techniques Module Examination. You are required to answer **THREE** questions of your choice from the **FIVE** supplied.
- Your CANDIDATE NUMBER must be placed on the top right corner of **each page**. Do not show your name on ANY of your papers, charts or computer printouts. If using Solar Fire Charts, ensure Solar Fire “Chart Page Compliments Text” does not contain your name or is turned off.
- Each answer should be clearly marked with the question number you are answering and each question should be stapled together as a separate unit. No loose papers please.
- TWO copies of each of your answer papers must be returned to the Exam Board Director, otherwise marking of your papers will be delayed whilst the Board awaits a second copy to be sent.
- Your answers must be returned to the Exam Board Director, postmarked **no later than Monday the 5th November 2007**. We recommend using Express Post to minimise the risk of lost or delayed exam papers.
- Once the examination commences and you then decide that due to personal circumstances you will not be completing the exam, please advise the Exam Board Director ASAP.

OTHER INFORMATION

This is an unsupervised examination. You may use a computer program to generate any or all of your data, however, please include details of your software in your bibliography. **All** sources of information used in your research must be included in your bibliography, including quotations. They should also be referenced within the text of your essay.



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Plagiarism¹ will result in failure in the exam so all sources must be acknowledged. Examiners will be marking on the validity of your argument, not right or wrong answers. You must also demonstrate the use of counselling skills which support the client. All statements made in your answers need to be supported with Astrological reasoning.

You may use any form or chart style or 90 degree dial.

Each essay must comply with a maximum word limit of up to 2,500 words with a +/- 10% tolerance. Not only are you assessed on your astrological knowledge, consideration is given to your ability to write a properly structured, succinct and academic work which may (with consent) later be published in the FAA Journal. The 2,500 word limit applies to the essay's Introduction, Body and Conclusion, this includes any footnotes, references or appendices. Any title page, charts, tables, bibliography and references are not included in the word limit.

Essays should be typed and double line spaced using a font of Times New Roman (or similar) with a , this includes any footnotes, references or appendices 12pt font size.

Answer only **THREE** questions from the five questions supplied.

Examiners will be looking for a synthesis of the dynamic methods in predictive work, as well as your ability to work only with the most important cycles.

Full significators must be listed to substantiate any statements you make. Statements that are not substantiated by appropriate and accurate significators will not attract marks.

Natal configurations, such as house positions, aspect patterns and rulerships should be taken into account in your analyses, only as far as they specifically relate to the question. A full natal delineation is not required.

Be sure to state your astrological reasoning throughout your answer. Ensure you include all charts generated with your answers.

Please indicate the word length at the end of each essay (introduction, body and conclusion only).

Special Note:

You are to assume that all clients in the following questions now reside in Sydney.

Question 1

Sue arrives late for her astrological consultation, something she normally never does; and is full of apologies. She and her husband are live-in managers of a hotel that has previously been allowed to become 'run down'. Amongst other duties, Sue is refurbishing the snack bar to a more up-market bistro. Everything is getting on top of her as the owners are making unreasonable demands and she feels she is always on call. Although her relationship with her husband is good and they plan to start a family soon, he is complaining that even though they have a day off together she spends it doing the housework.

Using a combination of Transits and Progressions from July 2007 till July 2008 what are the potential pitfalls and challenges Sue may face? Are there any underlying patterns or themes contributing to Sue's difficulties? If so, how may you assist her in addressing them enabling her to find a more balanced lifestyle?

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Question 2

Kate is newly engaged and plans to marry in early January 2008 to a man a few years younger than herself. She runs her own small business and has worked hard to gain a measure of financial security, however, she is worried about the impact her pending marriage will have on this. Although Kate gets on well with her future mother-in-law, who approves of the wedding, she finds her very interfering. Kate is also having problems with her children from a previous marriage, particularly the youngest son who is 23 years old, has just lost his job and is still living at home.

Using Solar Arc Directions for 2008 what is Kate being challenged to change and what guidance can you give her so that she is able to work through the above issues? Apply the 8th Harmonic aspects of conjunction, semi-square, square, sesqui-square and opposition only, allowing a 1 degree orb.

(Birth date - 15 January 1964, 5:28 am; Port Elizabeth, South Africa. Asc near 25 Capricorn.)

Question 3

Elizabeth who enjoys her job as a Real Estate Agent has a history of failed relationships. Due to financial reasons, she has just bought a house with an ex-boyfriend, someone with whom she has always maintained a close friendship. The plan is to co-tenant for five years and then Elizabeth will have enough saved to purchase her own town house. The ex-boyfriend has started a new relationship, forcing Elizabeth to realize that perhaps she still has feelings for him. She feels awkward and embarrassed whenever he brings the new girlfriend home and when she mentions this to him, is told to "get over it".

She is also being head hunted by a bigger and more dynamic Real Estate Agent who can offer her better conditions. Elizabeth feels torn as she has strong feelings of loyalty to her current employer.

Using the current Transits and Progressed Moon phase what may be hindering Elizabeth and how can you empower her to move forward in her life.

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Question 4

Belinda's consultation is in early 2006. While their house is being built, she, her husband and two young children are back living with her very supportive mother. Her eldest child has started school and her youngest starts next year. Belinda is thinking of going back to work, even though her husband is working two jobs, money is still tight. Her previous work experience has been in retail but she is toying with the idea of advancing herself by applying to do a part time accountancy course.

Using the Solar Return charts for 2006 and 2007, location Sydney, which chart best supports her employment prospects and /or educational aspirations and what challenges may she face.

Question 5

Rose is a beautiful young woman completing her first year in Environmental Studies at University. She has a belief in Buddhism and a strong interest in karma and past lives. Due to her mother's mental health issues, her father, who she adores, raised Rose and her siblings. Rose took on the role of mother to her younger brothers; washing, cleaning and cooking. Rose has difficulty accepting that some people cannot be helped and as a result is sometimes taken advantage of. She has good friendships but finds it hard getting close to people, as they tend to move out of her life. Her current best friend is moving interstate.

With the Uranus and Pluto ingress over the next few years what are the possible affects and issues that may be raised for Rose by these two outer bodies. Given that Rose will turn 21 years of age in 2009 and will experience the generic cycle of Saturn square Saturn and Uranus square Uranus, how will the above transits influence the inner process of growth and development indicated by this phase of the life cycle?
